



Grow as a Campus Missionary

- 1. Pray daily for each friend on your Five-Friend Focus card and for God to open doors for campus ministry.**

“Devote yourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful. And pray for us, too, that God may open a door for our message, so that we may proclaim the mystery of Christ, for which I am in chains” (Colossians 4:2-3, NIV).

“Finally, brothers, pray for us that the message of the Lord may spread rapidly and be honored, just as it was with you” (2 Thessalonians 3:1, NIV).
- 2. Pray that Christians will pray, live, tell, serve, and give at school.**

“He told them, ‘The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field’” (Luke 10:2, NIV).
- 3. Pray for the school leaders—students, principals, teachers, staff members, and coaches.**

“I urge, then, first of all, that requests, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for everyone—for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness” (1 Timothy 2:1-2, NIV).

“Give your servant success today by granting him favor in the presence of this man” (Nehemiah 1:11, NIV).
- 4. Schedule a day of fasting and prayer each semester.**

“If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then will I hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and will heal their land” (2 Chronicles 7:14, NIV).
- 5. Encourage others to identify themselves as Christians on campus and establish a standard for how a Christian lives. (You’re either a missionary or a mission field.)**

“I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes: first for the Jew, then for the Gentile” (Romans 1:16, NIV).
- 6. Serve your school by organizing and/or participating regularly in a Christian campus club.**

“And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds. Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching” (Hebrews 10:24,25, NIV).
- 7. Look for opportunities to share Jesus each day.**

“Then Jesus came to them and said, ‘All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age’” (Matthew 28:18-20, NIV).
- 8. Love others, including other Christians, regardless of denomination.**

“By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another” (John 13:35, NIV).
- 9. Use the classroom, extracurricular involvement, and other activities as opportunities to share Christ.**

“But in your hearts set apart Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect” (1 Peter 3:15, NIV).
